The repair station must show a need to maintain U.S.-registered aircraft for which maintenance is being conducted under § 145.205(d). All locations must hold UK Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) line station approval and be under the direct surveillance of the UK CAA. Line maintenance under the UK CAA is not authorized in the United States.
